



Daily Log Stewards Report Delaware Park

Approved scratches for today, reviewed and filed veterinarian daily treatment sheets and blood gas test results.

Administrative:

Dr. Craig Goldblatt is the substitute Associate Commission Veterinarian.

Post-race test results from Truesdail Laboratories, Inc. revealed the following:

- All Samples from July 13, 2016 were cleared including samples #17917, #18225, #18253, #18256 and #18384 which had been previously placed on hold.
- Samples from July 14, July 16, and July 18, 2016 were cleared with the exception of #18152 on July 18, 2016 which were placed on hold.
- All graded stakes samples from July 16, 2016 were cleared.

Administrative Hearings:

Film reviews were held today for the fourth race on Monday, July 25, 2016. The video concerned the run down the stretch where the #5, "Ride the Shark," with jockey David Amiss came out bumping the #3, "Cattindog," ridden by Winston Kay. Following review, no administration action was taken.

On Tuesday, July 26, 2016 we held a hearing for apprentice jockey Mr. Silvestre Gonzalez who had tested positive for marijuana. As a result of the hearing Mr. Gonzalez was suspended pending evaluation and recommendation from the Drug and Alcohol counselor. The counselor Ms. Nan Bernardo M.S.C.C. must send the Stewards a written evaluation and recommendation, along with a negative test result before a reinstatement hearing will be considered.

On Tuesday, July 26, 2016 we held a telephonic hearing for owner Mr. Brian Domenick for failure to follow the directive of a security officer; driving a motorcycle into the stable area. Mr. Domenick apologized for his actions and was issued a warning.

On Tuesday, July 26, 2016 we held a hearing for Trainer Mr. James Farley for failure to comply with the board of Stewards request for a veterinarian certificate concerning a vet scratch. Mr. Farley complied with the Stewards request and no further action was warranted.

FIRST RACE – POST TIME – 1:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:16 p.m. #5, “French Paradox,” was a vet scratch. #6, “Willie Wears Pink,” was selected for a blood gas test. #7, “Uncle Leo,” was claimed by Take a Shot LLC – Harry Wyner. **During the Race:** The #7, “Uncle Leo” was a clear winner. The placing judges posted a photo for place. The placing judges took down the photo and the #4, “Willful Warrior,” was posted as second and the #6, “Willie Wears Pink,” was posted as third, #1 “Roundelay” posted as fourth. The placing judges called the stewards stand and mutuels and voiced the order of finish as 7-4-6-1-3-2. The stewards repeated the numbers back to the placing judges as is protocol. The stewards called the tote company and confirmed the numbers 7-4-6-1 were posted on the tote board and asked them to make the result official. The stewards received a phone call a minute later from placing and were told that a mistake may have been made. The placing judges said the wrong horses for second and third may have been posted on the infield tote board, as communicated to the stewards and to mutuels by the placing judges for this race. The stewards asked for a photo to be printed that they could review. After examination of the photo the stewards determined that the actual placing for second should have been #6, “Willie Wears Pink,” with #4, “Willful Warrior,” finishing third. The Stewards could not change the official order of finish, or order payouts of a corrected order of finish. Executive Director of Racing Mr. John Mooney was apprised immediately of the situation. Refer to Delaware Racing Commission rule 14.19 Official Order of Finish as to Pari-Mutuel Payoff: *If foul riding or other cause for disqualification of any horse in a race is brought to the attention of the Stewards by the time the last Jockey in a race has weighed in, the Stewards shall rule on the extent of disqualification, if any, and shall determine the placing of the horses in the official order of finish for purposes of pari-mutuel payoff. After the Stewards have caused the "Official" sign to be flashed on the infield result board, the order of finish so declared official shall be final and no right of appeal therefrom shall exist insofar as the pari-mutuel payoff is concerned. Any subsequent change in the order of finish or award of purse money after the result of a race has been so declared official by the Stewards shall in no way affect the pari-mutuel payoff.* 4.7 Placing Judges: *Placing Judges shall occupy a stand directly above the finish line during the running of each race. The Placing Judges shall take special note of racing colors and distinguishing equipment carried by each horse. The Placing Judges shall determine the order of the horses as they cross the finish line by consideration of the respective noses of such horses. The Placing Judges shall cause the numbers of the first four horses to be flashed on the Result Board. Except for a good cause, a photo-finish camera shall be used as an aid by the Placing Judges in determining the order of the horses as they cross the finish line. Placing Judges may request a photo to assist in determining margins of less than a half-length. A forthcoming inquiry of the incorrect placing will be conducted by the Stewards.*

ORDER OF FINISH – “7 - 4 - 6 - 1.” Starters – 6 - Finish that was posted OFFICAL Correct order of finish should have been – “7- 6 – 4 – 1.”

SECOND RACE – POST TIME – 1:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:48 p.m.
ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 2 - 3 - 5.” Starters – 9

THIRD RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 2:18 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:28 p.m. #11, “Undeniable Temper,” #12, “Tap’n My Toes,” #13, “Uncle Harry,” and #14, “East Indies,” were scratched as alternates. #3, “Arcani,” was claimed by Bruno Schickedanz – Aldona Gonzalez. The #2, “Ifrit,” was a late scratch as he had flipped in the starting gate at post time. The #2 was scratched by the Stewards, upon the advice of acting Chief Commission Veterinarian Susan Botts. Jockey, Katie Davis was assessed at first aid by EMT Kristen Powers, who informed the Stewards that no injuries were noted or reported.

ORDER OF FINISH – “10 - 5 - 7 - 3.” Starters – 9

FOURTH RACE – POST TIME – 2:58 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:00 p.m. #2, “Final Forum,” and #5, “Awesome Ghost,” were vet scratches. We canceled Trifecta, Superfecta and Show wagering for this race as we were below five betting interests.

ORDER OF FINISH – “6 - 4 - 3 - 1.” Starters - 4

FIFTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 3:26 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:29 p.m. #11, “Country Money,” #12, “Anois Agus Aris,” were scratched as alternates. #5, “Spanish Prospector,” was selected for a blood gas test. #7, “Chicks Dig Bodie,” reared at the start breaking very slow.

ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 1 - 9 - 7.” Starters - 10

SIXTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:58 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:59 p.m. #1, “Charmin Charles,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. #2, “Papa Pablo,” was scratched due to heat related conditions. #3, “Got Humor,” and #8, “Two Bit Drifter,” were vet scratches. We canceled Superfecta wagering for this race as we were below six betting interests.

ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 7 – 1a - 5.” Starters - 5

SEVENTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 4:24 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:26 p.m. #2, “Sabbatarian,” and #10, “Cavity,” were scratched by their trainers. #6, “Supah Czech,” and #11, “Warrior Call,” were scratched as main-track only. #5, “Baychimo,” was selected for a blood gas test.

ORDER OF FINISH – “1 - 9 - 4 - 8.” Starters - 8

EIGHTH RACE – POST TIME – 4:55 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:56 p.m. Victor Carrasco, named on #1a, “Sheikinator,” was changed to Daniel Centeno; no double jocks mount. #5, “Royal Marine,” was selected for a blood gas test.

ORDER OF FINISH – “1 - 4 – 1a – 5 - 2.” Starters – 7
