Approved scratches for today, reviewed and filed veterinarian daily treatment sheets and blood gas test results.

Administrative:

Dr. Craig Goldblatt is the substitute Associate Commission Veterinarian.

Post-race test results from Truesdail Laboratories, Inc. revealed the following:

- Samples from July 21, July 23, and July 25, 2016 were cleared with the exception of #18117, from July 23, and #18338 from July 25, 2016 which were placed on hold.
- All Samples screened for Cobalt Chloride were cleared.

Administrative Hearings:

On Tuesday, August 2, 2016 we held a hearing for former jockey agent Mr. John Silva for failure to appear before the Stewards at a scheduled hearing for Tuesday, May 28, 2013. The hearing was scheduled in reference to criminal charges and conviction for Distribution of Controlled Substances on the grounds of the race track. Mr. Silva was convicted of selling CDS to an undercover officer of the Delaware State Police. The Stewards will render a decision after examining the information available on this matter at a future time.

Film reviews were held today for the first race on Monday, August 1, 2016. The video concerned the start and run down the backstretch where the #2, "She'alittlekeeper," with jockey Gary Wales was running off. The #3, "San Gregoria," with jockey Juan Torres was in front keeping a straight course. No action was warranted by the Stewards in this matter.

Review of the films for the third race on Monday, August 1, 2016 concerned the entire race. The #1, "Into Wilderness," ridden by Carol Cedeno alleged that the #6, "Stacey's Pumpkin," ridden by apprentice Kevin Mendez forced her horse out early in the race and came in on her horse at the top of the stretch and then out again in mid-stretch. The Stewards could see no video evidence to confirm the accusations, as the #6 was well clear of the #1

except at the top of the stretch where the #6 came in a little, with the #1 was also coming out at the same time but never getting close. As a result of the movies no action will be taken.

We held a hearing this morning for groom Arnulfo Vargas Torres for driving while intoxicated on the horse path and running through the adjacent fence. Mr. Torres will be assessed the fine of \$250.00, ordered to pay restitution for all damages incurred, along with the loss of stable area driving privileges. Mr. Torres was placed on a conditional license status.

FIRST RACE – POST TIME – 1:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:16 p.m. INQUIRY AT THE HALF MILE POLE - . Hold and claim of foul by jockey Kevin Gomez of the #2, “Sterlings America,” against the #3, “Stately Defence,” ridden by Daniel Centeno. The claim of foul was in reference to the #3, “Stately Defence,” coming in down the back-stretch causing the #2, “Sterlings America,” to check. After talking to the riders involved and reviewing the films of the race the Stewards saw no reason to take any action and made the race official. #4, “Silk n’ Sequins,” was selected for a blood gas test. #3, “Stately Defence,” was claimed by Run To Win Stable & Jagger Inc. – Jamie Ness.

SECOND RACE – POST TIME – 1:47 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:49 p.m. #1, “Colony Strike,” was selected for a blood gas test.

ORDER OF FINISH – “3 - 6 - 2 - 1.” Starters - 6

THIRD RACE – POST TIME – 2:16 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:18 p.m.

ORDER OF FINISH – “1 - 7 - 6 - 2.” Starters - 8

FOURTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 2:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:49 p.m.

INQUIRY AT THE START AND STRETCH - The #6, “Sommer Something,” broke slowly and then ran off with the rider coming down the stretch, almost running up on the heels of the horses in front of him. The Starter placed the #6 on the starters list for breaking slowly. #8, “City of Good,” was a vet scratch. #7, “Cool Seas,” was selected for a blood gas test.

ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 1 - 2 - 3.” Starters - 8

FIFTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:16 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:21 p.m. #11, “Love the Beat,” #12, “W. Harvey,” #13, “R.A. Superstar,” and #14, “Empty Prize,” were scratched as alternates. #8, “Open Petition,” was selected for a blood gas test.

ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 8 - 10 - 4.” Starters - 10

SIXTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:51 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:52 p.m. INQUIRY TOP OF STRETCH – At the top of the Stretch the #3, “Hickory Hill,” with rider Taylor Hole came out bumping the #4, “On Tap,” with rider Carol Cedeno. After reviewing the films of the race with the #4 finishing in front of the #3 the Stewards saw no reason to take any action and made the race official. #1, “Go Bo Go,” was scratched by its trainer. #6, “Strong Shaft,” was a vet scratch. #7, “Regal Strike,” was selected for a blood gas test. We canceled Superfecta wagering for this race as we were below six betting interests.

ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 3 - 5 - 7.” Starters - 5

SEVENTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 4:18 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:21 p.m. Nik Juarez, named on #7, “Zouzou,” was changed to Daniel Centeno; no double jocks mount. #3, “Marvey Marley,” was a vet scratch. #10, “Lady Sequoia,” pulled up lame following the race. The #10 was examined by Acting Chief Commission Veterinarian Susan Botts who told the Stewards that the horse had injured its left front ankle. Subsequently, “Lady Sequoia” was transported from the racing surface via horse ambulance.

ORDER OF FINISH – “7 - 4 - 6 - 11.” Starters -10

EIGHTH RACE – THE WHITE CLAY CREEK STAKES - POST TIME – 4:51 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:52 p.m. #7, “Southernperfection,” was scratched in compliance with the stakes race provision rule 11.14.1.1.
