Approved scratches for today, reviewed and filed veterinarian daily treatment sheets and blood gas test results.

Administrative:

Post-race test results from Truesdail Laboratories, Inc. revealed the following:

- All Samples from August 17, 2016 were cleared.

Administrative Hearings:

We received a phone call from trainer Allison Hassig requesting that the Stewards void the claim of the horse. “Imslopokerodriguez,” who was claimed by owner Juan Arriagada and trainer Allison Hassig out of the fifth race on Thursday, August 25, 2016. The reason she stated for voiding the claim was that the horse was a colt and not a gelding. Earlier in the day when the veterinarians were doing pre-race exams, Acting Chief Commission Veterinarian Susan Botts called stating in error that she thought the horse was a gelding and not a colt. The correction of a gelding not a colt was recorded and announced by the announcer. Also a sign was placed on the claim box indicating that the horse was a gelding and not a colt. The original program was printed correctly having the horse listed as a colt. Approximately an hour after the claim we received a call from Ms. Hassig wanting the claim voided on the grounds that the horse was actually a colt and not a gelding. Ms. Hassig was informed that the Stewards would not void the claim. Under DTRC rule 13.18 – Caveat Emptor: Notwithstanding any designation of sex or age appearing on the racing program or in any racing publication, the claimant of a horse shall be solely responsible for determining the age or sex of the horse claimed. Ms. Hassig was informed that if she still wants to pursue this matter she should file a protest in writing with the Stewards.

SECOND RACE – POST TIME – 1:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:46 p.m. #1, “The Great Seven,” was a vet scratch.

ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 8 - 2 - 3.” Starters - 8

THIRD RACE – POST TIME – 2:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:17 p.m. #10, “Ruthenium,” was scratched by the racing office to re-enter.

ORDER OF FINISH – “1 - 6 - 3 - 2.” Starters - 11

FOURTH RACE – POST TIME – 2:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:46 p.m. #8, “Pocketfullofgreen,” was selected for a blood gas test. #5, “Alberta Clipper,” was claimed by Jayenne Associates Ltd. – Andrew Simoff. #1, “She’salittlekeeper,” collapsed shortly after the finish line, unseating jockey Martin Solis. The #1 was examined by Commission Veterinarian Jane Teichner who stated that the horse may have collapsed from heat exhaustion. The horse was treated with ice water. After a short time the #1 got up walking off the racing surface. Jockey Martin Solis was assessed at first aid by EMT William Disc, who informed the Stewards that no injuries were noted or reported.

ORDER OF FINISH – “6 - 5 - 8 - 4.” Starters - 8

FIFTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 3:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:17 p.m. #4, “Hollywood Tomcat,” was a vet scratch. #5, “Alexandera’s Miss,” was scratched as a main track only. #11, “My Vixen,” #13, “Variety of Colors,” and #14, “West side Jazz,” were scratched as alternates.

ORDER OF FINISH – “6 - 9 - 10 - 3.” Starters - 9

SIXTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:47 p.m. INQUIRY AT THE TOP OF THE STRETCH RUN. - Hold and claim of foul by jockey Scott Spieth of the #3, “Patriotic Endeavor,” against the #5, “Michael’s Butterfly,” ridden by Daniel Centeno. The claim of foul was in reference to the #5 coming out at the top of the stretch carrying out the #3. A review of the video revealed that the #3 went out with the #5 following the #3, with clear space between them with no contact. After talking to the riders involved and having reviewed the video the Stewards saw no reason to take any action and made the race official. #8, “Elle Va,” was selected for a blood gas test.

ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 1 - 5 - 7.” Starters - 8

SEVENTH RACE – POST TIME – 4:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:16 p.m. ON THE TURF – INQUIRY IN THE STRETCH RUN. - Hold and claim of foul by jockey Brian Pedroza of the #6, “Say No Maux,” against the #11, “Chicks Dig Brodie,” ridden by Gary Wales. The #11, was accused of coming out during the stretch run carrying out and causing the rider of the #3 to check his horse. Review of the video revealed that the #11 drifted out very little if any with the #6 checking when the #8 drifted in a little. After talking to the riders involved and having reviewed the video the Stewards saw no reason to take any action and made the race official. Ashley Castrenze, named on #6, “Say No Maux,” was changed to Brian Pedroza; no double jocks mount. #12, “Susprising Soul,” #13, “Invisible Crown,” and #14, “Corstorphine (IRE),” were scratched as alternates. #5, “D’Wonder Boyd,” was selected for a blood gas test.

ORDER OF FINISH – “11 - 8 - 10 - 6.” Starters - 11

EIGHTH RACE – POST TIME – 4:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:46 p.m. #2, “Big Guy Ian,” was a vet scratch. #7, “Hear the Chatter,” was a vet scratch. #6, “This Boy’s Sharp,” was selected for a blood gas test. We canceled Superfecta wagering for this race as we were below six betting interests.

NINTH RACE – ARABIANS - POST TIME – 5:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 5:15 p.m. #6, “A Ladys Man,” was selected for a blood gas test.
