Approved scratches for today, filed ambulance transport reports from management, veterinarian daily treatment sheets, and blood gas test results.

Equine Forensic Drug Testing

We received confirmation from Dalare Associates for the test on hold from Saturday, May 12, 2012, was sample #D-06223 from the winner, "ES LA MIA" out of the third race on May 12, 2012 which was positive for the drug "BOLDENONE," trade name, "EQUIPOISE".

We requested Commission Inspector's Mr. Francis Swift and Mr. Ramon Rodriguez to conduct a barn search this morning concerning the BOLDENONE positive. The barn and tack rooms assigned to trainer, Juan Vasquez were inspected. Results of the search did not reveal any contraband or evidence related to the positive test.

Administrative

Mr. Vazquez came in following the barn search and we explained the charges against him and his right to a split sample from our list of three accredited laboratories. The list is comprised of Pennsylvania Equine Toxicology and Research Laboratory, University of California at Davis, and Iowa State University. Mr. Vazquez will let us know within a few days which lab he will select.

FIRST RACE – POST TIME – 1:15 pm. OFF TIME – 1:16 pm. #7, "My Espresso," was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – "1 - 6 - 2 - 3."** **INQUIRY AT THE TOP OF THE STRETCH** – Hold and claim of foul by the #3, "Bettern Biscuits," Mr. Ricardo Chiappe, against the #6, "Mambo Maya," Mr. Daniel Centeno, at the three-eighths pole for coming over in front of him, causing him to have to take up on his horse. After talking to the riders involved and reviewing the films of the race, it looked to us as though the #6 was well clear of the #3 when he came in. As to the "Inquiry" at the top of the stretch, the #1, "Country Chic," ridden by Able Castellano Jr. was getting out but did not bother any other horse while doing so. No action was taken for the first or second incident.

SECOND RACE – POST TIME – 1:43 pm. OFF TIME – 1:46 pm. ORDER OF FINISH – “6 – 1a - 4 - 3.”

THIRD RACE – POST TIME – 2:10 pm. OFF TIME – 2:13 pm. #1, “Sun Song,” was scratched as the horse was late for Salix administration. #3, “C. Lady’s Warrior,” was a vet scratch. **ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 7 - 6 - 5.”** We experienced a nine minute tote delay in making this race official.

FOURTH RACE – POST TIME – 2:40 pm. OFF TIME – 2:41 pm. #2b, “Tripp O Steel,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. **ORDER OF FINISH – “6 - 1 - 4 - 2.”**

In between the fourth and fifth races we received a phone call from the Jocks room wanting to tell us that there were a lot of rocks on the racing surface, they questioned if we would tell someone of this issue. Steward Burkhardt called track superintendent Mr. Ken Brown to inform him of the riders concerns. Mr. Brown stated that he was surprised and would check on this report. Executive Director of Racing Mr. John Mooney was also informed of this issue, telling us that it would be investigated.

FIFTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:07 pm. OFF TIME – 3:08 pm. #2, “Mandatum,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 3 - 6 - 2.”** #7, “Plenty O’Jack,” who was ridden by Javier Santiago was eased at the seven-eighths pole, pulling up after the race. “Plenty O’Jack,” was examined by Associate Commission Veterinarian, Jane Teichner, who said the horse was off in the right front. Dr. Teichner requested the horse ambulance to transport the horse to its stall.

SIXTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:33 pm. OFF TIME – 3:34 pm. #2, “Wiseman’s Bluff,” and #5, “Singapore Thunder,” were vet scratches. #1, “Park Rules,” was selected for a blood gas test. We canceled Superfecta, Trifecta, and Show wagering for this race as we were below five betting interests. The #3, “Schlossed,” was claimed by Nick Sanna Stables LLC – Jonas Gibson. **ORDER OF FINISH – “3 - 6 - 1 - 4.”**

SEVENTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:58 pm. OFF TIME – 4:04 pm. ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 5 - 1 - 4.” The #6, “Thunder T,” was getting out the entire race finishing last. We will talk to the trainer Mr. Peter Klesaris about this issue.

EIGHTH RACE – “The Grover “Buddy” Delp Memorial Overnight Stakes” - POST TIME – 4:30 pm. OFF TIME – 4:34 pm. #4, “Big Kick,” was scratched as this is a stakes race. We canceled Trifecta, and Show wagering for this race as we were below five betting interests. **ORDER OF FINISH – “1 - 3 - 5 - 2.”** #3, “Reckless Jerry,” who was ridden by Joe Rocco Jr. was eased at the three-quarter pole, pulling up after the race. “Reckless Jerry,” was examined by Associate Commission Veterinarian, Jane Teichner, who said the horse was off in the right front. Dr. Teichner requested the horse ambulance transport the horse to its stall.

NINTH RACE – POST TIME – 4:59 pm. OFF TIME – 5:00 pm. #1, “Breaking News,” was a vet scratch. **ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 3 - 7 - 4.”**

TENTH RACE – ARABIANS - POST TIME – 5:28 pm. OFF TIME – 5:30 pm. The rider on the #1a, “Generator,” Mr. Santos Chavez, was changed to Mr. Juan Torres, as Mr. Chavez, is riding the other part of the same-owner entry. #1, “Gurkha,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “7 - 3 - 5 - 2.”** Santos Chavez, rider of the #1, “Gurkha,” put the race on hold and claimed foul against the #7, “Nouveau Rich,” for coming in down the stretch and causing him to take up on his mount. After reviewing the films of the race and talking to the riders involved, it looked to us as though the #1, came out down the stretch, causing the problem. Subsequently, no action was taken.
