We approved scratches for today, reviewed and filed veterinarian daily treatment sheets, and blood gas test results.

**Equine Forensic Drug Testing:**

Post-race test results from Dalare Associates for August 25, and August 27, 2012, were clear with the exception of sample D-7780 collected on August 27, which is on hold by Dalare Associates for further testing. Additionally, the August 27, sample D-8086 was positive for “Phenylbutazone” in the amount of 2.74 micrograms per milliliter of plasma.

We requested the Commission’s Inspectors, Swift and Rodriguez to conduct a barn search concerning the “Phenylbutazone” positive. The assigned barn and tack rooms of Julio Cartagena were inspected. The results of the search discovered phenylbutazone pills, no other contraband was found. Trainer Cartagena waived his right to a split sample, and a hearing in this matter. Mr. Cartagena will be issued a five hundred (\$500.00) dollar fine, for a first offense of this kind during 2012.

A Stewards special test collected from the horse “Lady Diva” trained by Ms. Carla Morgan, following the seventh race on August 25, 2012, tested positive for “Trenbolone” in the amount of 65 picograms per-milliliter of plasma.

**SECOND RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 1:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:47 p.m. INQUIRY AT THE START – The #7, “Flirtingwithforty,” ridden by Juan Molina Jr., bucked just as the doors to the gate opened losing its jockey. Jockey Molina Jr. was examined by EMT Nancy Brant at first aid, signed a refusal of treatment form and will resume riding. ORDER OF FINISH – “8 - 3 - 4 - 1.” Starters - 9**

**THIRD RACE – POST TIME – 2:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:15 p.m. #1, “Just a Coincidence,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. #3, “Garryowen,” was selected for a blood gas test. ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 6 - 3 - 5.” Starters - 6**

**FOURTH RACE – POST TIME – 2:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:46 p.m.** #1, “Maharani Ursula,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. #7, “Cat in Motion,” was claimed by John Fanelli – Juan Vazquez. **ORDER OF FINISH – “1a - 3 - 5 - 7.” Starters - 7**

**FIFTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 3:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:15 p.m.** #7, “Self Made Man,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 6 - 8 - 7.” Starters - 9**

**SIXTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:46 p.m.** After a three-way shake, #1, “Standing O,” was claimed by Midwest Thoroughbreds Inc – Jamie Ness. The owner and trainer of that claim, requested a one hundred and seventy five (\$175.00) dollar all inclusive special test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “3 - 1 - 7 - 4.” Starters - 7**

**SEVENTH RACE – POST TIME – 4:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:16 p.m.** #2, “Captian Zulu,” and #3, “Gold Rock,” were vet scratches. #4, “The Party’s Here,” was selected for a blood gas test. We canceled Trifecta, Superfecta and Show wagering for this race as we were below five betting interests. **ORDER OF FINISH – “1 - 4 - 5 - 6.” Starters - 4**

**EIGHTH RACE – “THE STONEWALL FARM OCALA FOREVER TOGETHER OVERNIGHT STAKES” - POST TIME – 4:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:48 p.m.** #5, “Fontley (GB),” was scratched as this is a stakes race. #11, “Dinner’s Out (GB),” #12, “Giant Sensation,” #13, “Fugitive Angel,” and #14, “Withgreatpleasure,” were scratched as alternates. **ORDER OF FINISH – “8 - 10 - 2 - 7.” Starters - 9**

**NINTH RACE – ARABIANS - POST TIME – 5:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 5:16 p.m.** #2, “Grate Fire,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 5 - 2 - 6.” Starters - 6**

#4, “Litle Bit,” was claimed by Quarter Moon Ranch – Scott Powell. The claim for the #4, “Litle Bit,” was voided following the races at approximately 6:30 p.m. Investigation by Stewards Houghton and Lima involved the examination of the claimant’s signature on the claim slip and comparing it to the signature on the owner’s application which did not match. Furthermore, the name “POWELL” was misspelled as “POELL.” Consequently, “Litle Bit” was returned to Bill Waldron, the original Owner-Trainer, prior to the horse being released from the test barn.
