Weather: Sunny, mid 70's
Track - Fast Turf – Yielding **1:15 post time**

Approved scratches for today, reviewed and filed veterinarian daily treatment sheets, and blood gas test results.

FIRST RACE – POST TIME – 1:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:19 p.m. #5, “Alta Boy,” and #7, “Rare Lukey,” were vet scratches. We canceled Superfecta wagering for this race as we were below six betting interests. **ORDER OF FINISH – “6 - 4 - 3 - 2.” Starters - 5**

SECOND RACE – POST TIME – 1:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:46 p.m. The rider on the #1, “Indy Heir,” Ricardo Santana Jr., was changed to Alex Cintron; no double jocks mount. #3, “Mach Twelve,” was scratched by the racing office to re-enter. **ORDER OF FINISH – “7 - 2 - 6 - 5.” Starters - 7**

THIRD RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 2:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:17 p.m. #4, “Personal Flight,” was selected for a blood gas test. Douglas Seyler, the trainer of the #1, “Travelin Dream,” put the race hold pertaining to the stretch run. No Inquiry was called in this race by the Stewards. No hold or claim of foul was lodged by the jockey Mr. Daniel Centeno. After reviewing the films and talking to Mr. Centeno, we could see where the #1 under left handed urging came out brushing with the winner #3. Mr. Centeno also said his horse came out brushing the #3 in the stretch. No action was taken. **ORDER OF FINISH – “3 - 2 - 1 - 5.” Starters - 8**

FOURTH RACE – POST TIME – 2:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:46 p.m. #2, “Foxy Sarah,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 3 - 5 - 1.” Starters - 6**

FIFTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 3:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:16 p.m. #6, “Kinginthecity,” was selected for a blood gas test. #4, “My Magnolia,” ridden by Daniel Centeno, bolted on the first turn and was pulled up at the five-sixteenths pole. The #4 was led back to the unsaddling area by the outrider, and then walked off the track under its own power. Jockey Centeno told us when we called him, that the horse could not handle the yielding turf. Associate Commission Veterinarian Kathleen Picciano observed the horse to be sound, when jogging back to unsaddle. **ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 1 - 3 - 7.” Starters - 9**

SIXTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:45 p.m. #1a, “Parade of Colors,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. #2, “Are You Jokin Me,” was a vet scratch. #6, “Win Picture,” was claimed by, King Star – Juan Vazquez. #4, “Grand Gracie,” who was ridden by Brian Pedroza, was eased at the seven-eighths pole, pulling up after the race. The #4, “Grand Gracie,” was examined by Associate Commission Veterinarian Kathleen Picciano, who said the horse was lame in the right front. Dr. Picciano requested the horse ambulance transport the horse back to its stall. **ORDER OF FINISH – “6 - 3 - 4 - 1.”**

SEVENTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 4:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:17 p.m. #11, “Awesome Mich,” was scratched as a main-track only. **ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 8 - 5 - 3.”** **Starters - 10**

EIGHTH RACE – ARABIANS - POST TIME – 4:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:46 p.m. Tyrone Carter, the scheduled rider on the #1, “Trayton,” was changed to Jorge Rodriguez; no double jocks mount. #4, “RB Brilliant,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “4 – 1a - 6 - 7.”** **Starters - 8**
