



Daily Log Stewards Report Delaware Park

Date: Wednesday, October 17, 2012 Racing Day: # 90
Weather: Partly Cloudy, high 60's
Track - Fast Turf – Firm 1:15 post time

Approved scratches for today, reviewed and filed veterinarian daily treatment sheets, and blood gas test results.

Equine Forensic Drug Testing:

On Tuesday, October 16, 2012, we received confirmation of a “Clenbuterol” positive from Dalare Associates, for urine Sample D-07007 collected on Monday, October 8, 2012 in the seventh race, for the horse “Ghostbuster”.

We requested Commission Inspector Mr. Francis Swift to conduct a barn search this morning concerning the “Clenbuterol” positive. The barn and tack rooms assigned to trainer, Jeff Talley were inspected. Results of the search revealed a 460 milliliter container of “Clenbuterol”.

Mr. Talley came in this morning, we explained the charges against him and his right to a split sample from our list of three accredited laboratories. The list is comprised of Pennsylvania Equine Toxicology and Research Laboratory, University of California at Davis, and Iowa State University. Mr. Talley has waived his right to a split sample, and a Stewards hearing in this matter. Mr. Talley will be fined the sum of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars, and suspended for seven calendar days. The horse “Ghostbuster” will be disqualified from all purse monies, in the seventh race on Monday, October 8, 2012.

Administrative:

Associate Commission Veterinarian Mary Durando, is substituting today.

Four Jockeys were randomly selected today for testing. Three of Jockeys tested were negative. The fourth jockey tested positive for Amphetamines, which he has a doctor's prescription for.

We received a phone call at 4:00 P.M. from assistant racing secretary Jerome Doro, stating that a horse was not entered in the two-year old fillies Delaware Certified stakes, the entry was taken by hand on the entry pad, but the entry was not registered or printed in the computer. We were asked to allow this race to be re-drawn with the horse that was left out included in the draw. This request was disallowed by the Stewards, as the overnights were out for some time, and the entries for the races were published on the internet.

FIRST RACE – POST TIME – 1:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:16 p.m. #4, “First Show,” was selected for a blood gas test. #7, “I’ll Chaseyoubilly,” with rider Alex Cintron, was a late scratch, as he unseated the rider in the post parade running off one mile before being caught by the outriders. The rider Mr. Cintron was uninjured when he was unseated. **INQUIRY SHORTLY AFTER THE START** – Shortly after the start the #1, “Lookoutforlove,” with rider Yomar Orlando Ortiz, ducked to the inside at the gap to the main track, unseating the rider. The Jockey Mr. Ortiz was examined by EMT Amy Trowbridge, who reported that Mr. Ortiz appeared to be uninjured, signing a refusal of treatment form to continue riding.
ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 3 - 4 - 6.” Starters - 6

SECOND RACE – POST TIME – 1:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:46 p.m. Yomar Orlando Ortiz, the scheduled rider on the #1, “Barbara,” was changed to Daniel Centeno, as Mr. Ortiz was required by the Stewards, to sit out one race after being unseated; no double jocks mount. #1, “Barbara,” was selected for a blood gas test. A claim in for the #2, “Mine Only Mine,” by A. Clair Silva – Doug Seyler, was “VOID” as the race number was not entered on the claim blank. **ORDER OF FINISH – “3 - 1 - 7 - 4.” Starters - 7**

THIRD RACE – POST TIME – 2:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:15 p.m. ORDER OF FINISH – “6 - 5 - 1 - 4.” Starters - 6

FOURTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 2:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:46 p.m. #5, “Miner’s Tune,” was a vet scratch. #7, “Little pinkie,” was scratched as a main-track only. #2, “Offer,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “8 - 9 - 6 - 4.” Starters - 8**

FIFTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:16 p.m. #1, “Shine on Shine On,” was a vet scratch. #3, “Smarley,” with rider Estebaun Unsihuay pulled up in the stretch. The rider Mr. Unsihuay dismounted after pulling the horse up. The #3, “Smarley,” was examined by Chief Commission Veterinarian, John Peters, who diagnosed the horse’s condition as a right front sesamoid injury. Dr. Peters stabilized the injury with the Kinsey brace, requesting the horse ambulance to transport and return the horse to the barn. Dr. Peters called the Stewards at approximately 3:45 P.M. stating that, Private practicing Veterinarian Amy Warren, had euthanized the #3, “Smarley,” due to a catastrophic right front sesamoid injury. Post Mortem report to follow. **ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 4 - 7 - 6.” Starters - 6**

SIXTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:44 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:44 p.m. Alex Cintron, the scheduled rider on the #1a, “Face the Race,” was changed to Joe Bravo; no double jocks mount. The #5, “No Jurisdiction,” with rider Ricardo Santana Jr. was eased past the finish line.
ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 4 - 7 - 3.” Starters - 8

SEVENTH RACE – POST TIME – 4:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:16 p.m. After a five-way shake the #4, “Wildcat Aly,” was claimed by Brenda Rushing – Jonas Gibson. #8, “Sing It Again,” was claimed by Adventure Stable – Peter Walder. **ORDER OF FINISH – “6 - 4 - 8 - 1.” Starters - 8**

EIGHTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 4:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:45 p.m. #1a, “Let the Kitten Run,” was scratched as part of a same owner entry. #2, “Golden Rock,” was scratched as a main-track only. #10, “Portena,” was selected for a blood gas test. #11, “Stormy n’ Sly,” with rider Christian Olmo was getting out on the final turn. **ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 4 - 1 - 7.” Starters - 10**

NINTH RACE – ARABIANS - POST TIME – 5:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 5:15 p.m. Carlos Esquilin, the scheduled rider on the #6, “Grate Fire,” was changed to Yamil Rosario; no double jocks mount. **ORDER OF FINISH – “6 - 1 - 5 - 7.” Starters - 7**
