Approved scratches for today, reviewed and filed veterinarian daily treatment sheets, and blood gas test results.

**Equine Forensic Drug Testing:**

Post-race test results from Dalare Associates for September 4, and September 5, 2013 were all clear.

**Administrative:**

We have received the results of the split samples for “Stanozolol” that were sent to the University of California at Davis Diagnostic Laboratory, on Tuesday, August 20, 2013 for trainer Mr. Juan Vazquez. Sample #D-8623 retained from the horse, “Starforaday” which ran in the 3<sup>rd</sup> race on July 31, tested for “Stanozolol” in the amount of 79 picograms per-milliliter of plasma and sample #D-9887 retained from the horse, “Dr. Drew” from the 7<sup>th</sup> race on July 31 tested for “Stanozolol” in the amount of 74 picograms per-milliliter of plasma. As both of the split samples tested under the permissible amount of 100 picograms per-milliliter of plasma, all charges against Mr. Vazquez for “Stanozolol” positives shall be withdrawn.

Trainer Gary Katz waived his right to a split sample and hearing in the matter of his “Phenylbutazone,” positive. Sample #D-8965, which was retained from the horse, “WHO DAT BOY” ran in the 5<sup>th</sup> race on September 2, 2013 and tested positive for excessive levels of “Phenylbutazone,” in the amount of 8.37 micrograms per milliliter of plasma. Mr. Katz will be fined \$500.00, and suspended 7 calendar days, from Monday, September 23, 2013 through and including Sunday, September 29, 2013. The horse “Who Dat Boy” will be disqualified from all purse monies earned in that race.

A hearing was held today for trainer Timothy Walters, concerning a turf shoe rule violation, which resulted in a late scratch of the horse “Spookorific,” from the 2<sup>nd</sup> race on Wednesday, September 4, 2013. As a result of the hearing Mr. Walters was fined the sum of \$500.00

**FIRST RACE – POST TIME – 1:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:18 p.m.** #1, “Ziptomylu,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. **ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 6 - 4 - 5.” Starters - 6**

**SECOND RACE – POST TIME – 1:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:46 p.m.** Garry Cruise, the scheduled rider on the #3, “Stevia,” was changed to Abel Castellano Jr. #2, “Rosemont Drive” #5, Harley’s Wiseguy” and #8, “Misunderestimated,” were vet scratches. #4, “King Touch,” was scratched by the Stewards, as the horse was on the veterinarian’s list. #6, “Simba Bahari,” was selected for a blood gas test. We canceled Show, Trifecta, and Superfecta wagering for this race as we were below five betting interests. **ORDER OF FINISH – “3 - 6 - 1 - 7.” Starters - 4**

**THIRD RACE – POST TIME – 2:16 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:17 p.m. ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 5 - 6 - 1.” Starters - 6**

**FOURTH RACE – POST TIME – 2:48 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:49 p.m.** #4, “Sweet as a Kiss,” was selected for a blood gas test. A claim in for the #6, “Fragancia,” by Triple R. Stables – Rodolfo Romero, was “VOID” as the claim blank did not have a signature. **ORDER OF FINISH – “1 - 4 - 2 - 5.” Starters - 6**

**FIFTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 3:19 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:24 p.m.** Victor Carrasco, the scheduled rider on the #2, “Echale Salsita,” was changed to Gabriel Saez. #1a, “Sweet Abandon,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. #2, “Steal the Deal,” was scratched as a main-track only. **ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 5 - 1 - 7.” Starters - 9**

**SIXTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:50 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:51 p.m.** #1, “Summer Hustler,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. #6, “Giant Patriot,” was a vet scratch. #9, “Bigleagueprospect,” was scratched by the racing office to re-enter. #3, “Saarface,” was pulled up after the race and was removed from the racing surface via the horse ambulance. Chief Commission Veterinarian John Peters reported that the horse had re-bowed it’s right front tendon. **ORDER OF FINISH – “8 – 1a - 2 - 7.” Starters - 7**

**SEVENTH RACE – POST TIME – 4:22 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:24 p.m.** #1a, “Lemon Up,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. #5, “Cinder Block” and #6, “Trick Ridge,” were vet scratches. #7, “Hunting Gold Motel,” was scratched by it’s assistant trainer. #1, “Ransom Paid,” was pulled up at the three-eighths pole and was removed from the racing surface via horse ambulance. Chief Commission Veterinarian John Peters called, stating that the horse was off in the left front. Jockey, Julian Pimentel who rode the #1, jumped from his mount and held it until the arrival of the outrider. **ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 8 - 9 - 2.” Starters - 6**

**EIGHTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 4:54 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:57 p.m.** #1, “Space Race” #4, “Tappinintovictory” and #6, “Quiet Favorite,” were scratched as main-track only. #8, “Yourhonorandglory,” was a vet scratch. #9, “I Am the King,” was a vet scratch. #2, “The Great Bandini,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “11 - 7 - 3 - 10.” Starters - 6**

**NINTH RACE – POST TIME – 5:26 p.m. OFF TIME – 5:28 p.m.** #3, “Spark Won,” was a vet scratch. #2, “Downtomylastpenny,” was selected for a blood gas test. #5, “Discreet Dream,” was scratched by Associate Commission Veterinarian Jane Teichner, as the horse flipped hitting its head in the barn area while en-route the paddock. **INQUIRY IN THE STRETCH** – The #1, “Tapit Ten,” with rider Armando Ayuso came out over the heels of the #10, “Nearly a Notion,” with rider Martin Solis clipping the heels of the #10 in the stretch. The Stewards saw no reason to take any action. **ORDER OF FINISH – “7 - 8 - 6 - 9.” Starters - 8**
