FIRST RACE – POST TIME – 1:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:15 p.m. #1a, “Backyard Boogie,” was scratched as part of a same-owner entry. #2, “Kippy Fox,” was a vet scratch. **ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 7 - 6 - 3.” Starters - 6**

SECOND RACE – POST TIME – 1:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 1:46 p.m. #2, “Take the Offer,” was scratched by the racing office to re-enter. #9, “Very Lucky,” was scratched by the Stewards. #6, “Warrensburg,” was selected for a blood gas test. #4, “Magic Lion,” was claimed by Kazdan Racing Stables – Alejandro Maymo. #6, “Warrensburg,” was claimed by South View Stables – Michael Pino. A claim in for the #8, “Key to a Cure,” by Denise Cotrone, was **VOID** as the claim blank was filled out incorrectly. **ORDER OF FINISH – “4 - 8 - 3 - 6.” Starters - 7**

THIRD RACE – POST TIME – 2:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:16 p.m. After a four-way shake, #1, “Insighting,” was claimed by Juan Arriagada – Anthony Pecoraro. **ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 1 - 6 - 5.” Starters - 7**

FOURTH RACE – POST TIME – 2:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 2:46 p.m. #7, “Don’tstop Theparty,” was a vet scratch. #6, “Lily’s Peak,” was selected for a blood gas test. #6, “Lily’s Peak,” was claimed by Mary Eppler Racing Stable – Mary Eppler. **ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 4 - 6 - 2.” Starters - 7**

FIFTH RACE – POST TIME – 3:15 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:16 p.m. #1, “Make Me a Deal,” and #6, “Proud Patriot,” were vet scratches. We canceled Superfecta wagering for this race as we were below six betting interests. **ORDER OF FINISH – “3 - 5 - 7 - 2.” Starters - 5**

SIXTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 3:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 3:48 p.m. #3, “Dr. Drew,” was scratched as a main-track only. #11, “Written Word,” #12, “Yankee Mickey,” #13, “Gottalovethedrake,” and #14, “Irunalatte,” were scratched as alternates. #1, “Bert B Don,” was claimed by Home Team Stables – Scott Lake. #5, “Good Feng Shui,” was claimed by Midwest Thoroughbreds Inc. – Jamie Ness. #1, “Bert B Don,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “5 - 1 - 7 - 6.” Starters - 9**

At 4:02 p.m. just after the 6th race was official, we received a phone call from Executive Director of Racing John Mooney, stating that the #1, “Bert B Don,” who was in for the claiming price of \$15, 000 on the overnight and official program, was claimed by Home Team Stables – Scott Lake, and should have been in for the allowance conditions. The racing office supposedly had made a mistake when the horse was transferred from another race to this one. The trainer of #1, “Bert B Don,” A. Ferris Allen III called the Stewards, stating that he did enter the horse in the 6th race but the horse was supposed to be in for the allowance conditions not the claiming price, wanting the Stewards to void the claim. The Stewards could find no racing rule or regulation that would allow them to void the claim. The Stewards contacted Deputy Attorney General, Edward Black, for a legal opinion concerning this matter. Deputy Attorney General Black informed us that there is no portion of the Delaware Thoroughbred Racing Commission claiming rule 13 that would allow or require us to void this claim.

SEVENTH RACE – POST TIME – 4:17 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:18 p.m. #2, “Kennesaw Mountain,” and #8, “Hard Aces,” were vet scratches. #1, “Convoy Captain,” was selected for a blood gas test. **ORDER OF FINISH – “3 - 6 - 5 - 4.” Starters - 6**

EIGHTH RACE – ON THE TURF - POST TIME – 4:45 p.m. OFF TIME – 4:51 p.m. #1a, “Alinator,” was scratched as a main-track only. #5, “Jive Partner,” was scratched by the racing office to re-enter. #7, “Kela’s Wish,” was selected for a blood gas test. Hold and claim of foul by Alex Cintron, the rider on the #1, “Lake Michigan,” against rider, Brian Pedroza of the #4, “Swoop,” for coming out in the stretch, and bumping his horse. No inquiry was called in this race. The Stewards saw no reason to take any action, and made the race official. **ORDER OF FINISH – “2 - 3 - 9 - 4.” Starters - 8**
